# Seek the Lord

2025! Thanks be to God! He has safely brought us into another new year! In our Christmas celebrations we often hear the name "Immanuel," which of course means "God with us." As we enter this new year, the name "Immanuel" allows us to reflect on the previous year to see how God was working in our lives. It's always a time of remembrance. So, are you better off today than you were 365 days ago? Some of you certainly feel good about this past year. Some of you are uneasy. And some are on the verge of despair.

As we leave 2024 and enter 2025, we may want to evaluate our lives based on net worth, health condition, position at work, or some other earthly standard. But God's Word offers us another way to evaluate our life. The prophet Isaiah challenges us to consider what we put our faith and trust in. He writes: "Listen to me, you who *pursue righteousness* and who *seek the Lord"* (51:1)

Isaiah describes what needs to be foundational in our Christian life—the pursuit of righteousness and seeking after the Lord. Seeking God is not something that we do willingly. No, Isaiah says that we pursue righteousness and seek the Lord because of what *God* has done in us and for us in the person of Jesus Christ. Isaiah chapter 51 reminds us of God's extraordinary work, calling to our attention the many ways God's grace and mercy impact our lives. It's filled with words of restoration and comfort. God promises to comfort and restore us by strengthening our faith. We have the promise of forgiveness of sins and eternal life through faith in His Son. The Apostle Paul explains: "If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?" (Rom 8:31-31).

Our well-being begins with God's love for us in Jesus Christ, as the prophet writes, "My salvation will last forever, my righteousness will never fail" (v 6). This Good News gives us assurance and strength to endure what comes our way each day, month, and year. Nothing can separate us from God's love (Rom 8:38-39). "Listen to me, my people; hear me, my nation: The law will go out from me; my justice will become a light to the nations" (Is 51:4). This assures us of God's desire to save all people from their sins. I encourage you to read Isaiah 51 to be comforted and have the assurance of God's love for you.

By God's grace, we have passed through another year because God has made it possible. Despite our financial, physical, or employment status, we are blessed people because God always provides, he always meets our every spiritual need through the power of the Gospel. Are we better off today

#### God's Abundance

We have before us a whole new year. Think of the abundance of possibilities and opportunities God lays before us for service to His kingdom in the minutes and hours that make up the days of the year 2025!

Abundance is a characteristic of God. He gave His only Son Who declared to us, "I came that [you] may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10). Through Him and because of the abundance of His love for us, we "believe in Him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, obtaining the outcome of [our] faith, the salvation of [our] souls" (1 Peter 1:8-9). While He is slow to anger, the Lord is "abounding in steadfast love, forgiving iniquity and transgression" (Numbers 14:18).

He gives the gifts of His creation to us in abundance as well, for who can count the stars in the sky, the birds in the air, or the fish in the sea? He also pours out on His people gifts in abundance. According to God's grace, He has given us different gifts (Romans 12:6).

God has equipped and enabled us with His abundant gifts to seek out the lost, to lead and serve on committees and boards that do the work of ministry, to provide financial support for our church workers at home and in missions, and to teach and preach His Word for the salvation of souls and the edification of believers.

Perhaps you do not know where you fit into this picture. You even think you are not part of the picture. Not so! The Apostle Peter wrote, "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Peter 4:10). By this we know that each of us has at least one gift and that God holds each of us responsible for using that gift. Ask God to show you where He wants to use you.


