"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal" (Matthew 6:19). If earthly treasures become overly important, we will experience disillusionment and anxiety worrying about what we possess. Another danger in amassing earthly treasures is that our attention and loyalty is on material possessions. Focusing our thoughts on material things will undermine our relationship with Jesus and take away our joy and interest in His kingdom.

From the Principal's Desk: A Blessed New School Year at Immanuel Christian Academy

Peace and blessings to you all! I am filled with anticipation and gratitude for the blessings God has in store for us as we begin our Christian walk together. So, please feel free to contact me to volunteer to assist with or coordinate the wonderful opportunities that will develop because of our school and church community collaborations this year.

First, I would ask that you join me in welcoming Dr. Vickie Casanova to our school family. Her diverse talents and unwavering commitment to Christian education will truly assist our kindergarten student's spiritual growth and academic endeavors. Please join me in praying for her and all our faculty, staff, Day School Commission, and volunteers as we embark on a new year of ministry.

This year, our theme is "Our Mission is Fishing," from Matthew 4:19 which reads, "And he said to them, follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." Thus, we will nurture the students academically and spiritually through daily devotions, weekly chapel services, and our curriculum items that are rooted in biblical truth. It is our objective to cultivate a solid foundation of faith for each child we serve.

As we explore innovative programs and initiatives designed to enhance our educational experiences, we pray for your help with programs such as...

1. The creation of a STEM Curriculum (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics): This program will help our students to learn critical thinking skills that foster problem solving in their daily lessons through the integration of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) concepts.

2. The expansion of our Arts Program:

Please help the school by putting your creative talents to work in the areas of the visual arts, drama, music, (i.e., quilting, crochet, knitting, painting (water, color, oil, etc.) and more. We could use your help before school, after school, and during the day with play productions, a community choir, and the planning of summer camps and VBS for next year.

3. The development of a Service-Learning Leadership Program:

We pray that our students live their faith by serving our community. By doing so they will demonstrate Christ's love of them to others. Please assist us in formulating opportunities for our students to serve this year (i.e., nursing home visits, Habitat for Humanity Projects, food pantry assistants, hospital helpers, and more). We would also need your help in hosting a youth group for off campus activities (i.e., skating, bowling, movie night, and fishing trips) and a Christian Lock-in for our students this year for faith formation.

4. The return of School Clubs:

The students are eager to expand their Christian witness, team building skills, and sportsmanship outside of the classroom. As such, they are interested in additional boys and girls' sports, student council, pep squad, kindness crew, dance, boys/girls scouting, gardening club, cooking club, karate, sign language club, debate club, book club, yearbook, newspaper, science and robotics club, Beta Club, math/religion/science bowls, spelling bee, R.O.T.C., and much more. If God has purposed you to have a talent or interest in assisting students in these areas, please contact the school office to learn how you can assist in forming these clubs.

5. The development of an Alumni Affairs Office:

We would love to know where our alumni have gone over the years. We are seeking a volunteer to assist the school in creating an alumni affairs office. This would involve creating a database of previous graduates, sending communications, developing a newsletter, and formulating an account for gifts. We would like for our alumni to visit the school to speak with students during our "Lunch and Learn Program" and prayerfully get to a point where we can have reunions and homecomings. Please speak with me if you are interested in helping with this project.

Our Parent-Teacher League (PTL) is working diligently planning events that will build a keen sense of community in the school and with the church. Your participation in the planning of these events will be appreciated as we work and pray together this year.
