Walking the Walk

As God's stewards, we are not only to "talk the talk" but "walk the walk" as well. Through faith, we know that God entrusts us with time, abilities, and resources and that He empowers us to use them in service for others and to extend His kingdom. When we "walk the walk," we not only continue talking but we put our talk into action. The Apostle John wrote, "*Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth*" (1 John 3:18). God's love compels us to serve and bless others not only in words but also in deeds. The Apostle James tells us "*But be doers of the word…*" (James 1:22). As God's stewards, we use all that He entrusts to us as instruments through which we show love to others.

In the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37), we find a Samaritan who is "walking the walk." A Samaritan is traveling on the road from Jerusalem to Jericho when he finds a man along the road who had been robbed, beaten, and left for dead. If the Samaritan was just going to "talk the talk," he would have told the man who was beaten, "I love you, and I will pray for you." However, he "walked the walk" by stopping to help. Moved by compassion, he offered his time and talents by taking care of the man's wounds. The Samaritan went even further by putting the beaten man on his animal and taking him to an inn where he could be restored back to health. The Samaritan even used his own resources to pay the innkeeper for the man's care. He "walked the walk" by using his time, talents, and money to help a person in need.

The parable also illustrates two examples of people "talking the talk." Before the Samaritan found the robbed and beaten man, a priest and later a Levite saw the injured man but each walked away and offered no assistance. We can imagine that a priest and a Levite, in their preaching and teaching, would profess the importance of loving others, yet they failed to put their words into action.

As God's stewards, we seek opportunities to thank God for His love, forgiveness, and gifts by using our blessings in serving and giving to others. We are able and willing to help others because God's love within us overflows through us to others. May God help us all "walk the walk" and be the stewards we are called to be.

In the Parable of the Sower, Jesus warns us about how our attitude toward money and things can affect our response to God's Word. Jesus stated that some "seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them" (Matthew 13:7). He explained, "As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful" (Matthew 13:22). Having money and possessions can deceive you into believing that nothing is more important than owning things and enjoying the things money can buy. If the love of money controls your heart, God is pushed aside and your eternity with Him is endangered.

Jesus said, "The Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve" (Matthew 20:28). He asks no less of us than that we serve others as He has served us. The writer of Hebrews tells us that we are called and enabled to "serve the living God" (Hebrews 9:14). In our work as servants, we serve God by serving others. When Jesus was asked, "When did we see You a stranger and welcome You, or naked and clothe You?" Jesus replied, Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these My brothers, you did it to *Me*" (Matthew 25:38, 40).
