Keep Calm and Listen On!

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

Do you like roller coasters? I love them. I can't get enough of them; the more hoops, twists, and turns, the better. I enjoy moving so fast that the world becomes one big blur. Bring it! I find riding roller coasters to be rather therapeutic. Riding a roller coaster is a great way to stimulate antistress (happy) hormones in the brain; I'm pretty sure my doctor would prescribe roller coaster rides for me as an antidepressant. Super-fast twists, turns, and loops can work wonders for a stressful life. But what about when our world feels like we're riding a non-stop roller coaster?

The world today often feels like that and let's face it; we want to get off this out-of-control ride as soon as possible. Not so therapeutic. We try everything under the sun to figure out how to best deal with it. We entertain ourselves with movies. television, and music. Go out to a nice dinner. Visit a friend or family. Take a hot bath. There are many ways we try to reduce the level of stress on the

Participants in Jesus' Ongoing Work

God calls us to be His stewards (Genesis 1:28; 2:15), and we become faithful stewards when we understand and act upon our role as participants in God's plan to seek and save the lost (Luke 19:10). He wants us to be active, involved, and willing participants in His plan of salvation. He "desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4). As participants with the Lord, we become His hands, feet, and mouth through whom He works. In the Great Commission, Jesus tells us that we are to "go" (Matthew 28:19). Our Lord's mission becomes our mission so we are to be more than spectators.

Our involvement in the Great Commission is motivated by the Holy Spirit Who takes from us our hearts of stone and gives us our hearts of flesh (Ezekiel 36:26). With these new hearts, we can begin to understand how much God loves us and all people. Through faith, we know that He sent His Son to suffer and die on the cross for our redemption, which prompts us to commit our time, talents, and money to His service. We live lives with a new perspective, meaning, and purpose. Because of God's saving activity, we willingly surrender our lives and become participants in Jesus' mission to share the life-saving Gospel with all people.

God's Word is clear that we are saved by grace through faith and not by works (Ephesians 2:8-9). However, our mission efforts and works are part of God's plan so they are important to Him. *"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them"* (Ephesians 2:10). We are not saved by works but for works. As we participate in God's mission to seek and save the lost, we know that all of our works are merely responses to what God has already done for us.

By grace, Jesus has redeemed us, and we are a temple of the Holy Spirit Who is in us. We are notoHHo our own (1 Corinthians 6:20). He saved us for the purpose of being participants in His plan of salvation. He has gifted us so we can spend our lives serving and glorifying Him. We are not all called to be pastors nor are we all traveling to foreign mission fields as missionaries, but we are all called to serve God in some capacity. If we don't have a sense of mission, we are probably living for ourselves. In the words of the Apostle Paul, "And He died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for Him Who for their sake died and was raised" (2 Corinthian 5:15).

May God help us all be eager and willing participants in Jesus' ongoing work.

AS CREATED AND BAPTIZED CHILDREN OF GOD, WE ARE STEWARDS OF THE GOSPEL

"Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making His appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God" (2 Corinthians 5:20).

In Scripture, we see how God has used the testimony of people faithful in their giving to encourage the giving of others. In the book of Acts, we read of Barnabas' gift of property. "Thus Joseph, who was also called by the apostles Barnabas (which means son of encouragement), a Levite, a native of Cyprus, sold a field that belonged to him and brought the money and laid it at the apostles' feet" (Act 4:36-37). His gift was an encouragement for others to give. Among the believers, none lacked food or shelter, because those with surpluses were encouraged to share with those in need. Our giving can be a witness to our families, church, and potentially to our neighborhoods. May God grant us His grace to give, so that our giving can be a testimony of our faith to others.

PRE-HOLIDAY FOOD & FUND DRIVE-*UPDATED*:

This year we will be having a special Thanksgiving Turkey/Ham Giveaway, Scheduled for Tuesday, November 22nd at 11am. The timing of receiving the purchased turkeys and meal kits did not coincide with our regular Saturday distribution and I anticipate the same for December-Christmas giveaway. We will maintain Friday giveaways during the holidays to manage all the extra food. Thanks to Elmhurst-Yorkfield Food Pantry we will be able to purchase turkeys, hams, and meal boxes from Northern Illinois Food Bank.

Last year we gave away a total of 200 Holiday (Thanksgiving & Christmas) meal boxes at a cost of \$35 each (\$7,000). Although the cost of the meal box has risen considerably since last year, we will keep the cost at \$35, beginning fundraising on October 23.

Expansion Project Update:

It was a pleasure meeting with the Batterman Foundation early in October, we hope to have news regarding grant funding for the expansion project. Grant writing and funding is a slow and tedious process, new grant opportunities and news of grants should be coming in the coming year. I am hoping to have an online fundraising campaign ready to roll in December/ January as well as a new monthly pantry e-newsletter.
