# Living with Purpose

We, like most people, enjoy our careers that provide an income to pay for housing, transportation, and other necessities and comforts. We love our families. We try to be good neighbors in our communities, and we make every effort to be upstanding citizens. On the surface, our lives in many ways resemble non-Christians. However, as believers, we live with the awareness that God gives us a purpose that is much more meaningful than having successful careers, being good neighbors, or patriotic citizens.

Through faith, we understand the special purpose that God gives us is to be participants in His mission "to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10). The Apostle Paul wrote, God "desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4). We are His vessels through whom He works. We become His hands, feet, and mouth to share the life-saving Gospel to the world.

Jesus spelled out our purpose: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you will be My witnesses to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). Speaking to His disciples, Jesus said, "As the Father has sent Me, even so I am sending you." (John 20:21). The Holy Spirit provides the strength and motivation that we need as we are being sent to witness to others. Paul tells us that we have been reconciled with God through Christ (2 Corinthians 5:16-21) and have been given the ministry of helping others to come to know that peace with God. "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of His own possession," wrote Peter, "that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him Who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9). In what is referred to as the Great Commission, Jesus said, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20). These verses put an exclamation point in the purpose that God has for our lives. Early in the Gospels, Jesus calls His disciples, and He tells them that they will be fishers of men. The role of the disciples has now passed to us.

God's Word challenges us to use our time, talents, and money, so we can make an eternal difference in the lives of others. Because God is always with us, we can be faithful in our purpose to be God's participants in His mission to save all people. May we hear our Lord say, "Well done, good and faithful servant."



### Stewards of God's Creation

"In the beginning, God created..." In these first five words of the Bible, God gives us His first act of grace which is His creation. The Bible affirms that He created the world out of nothing. "Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever You had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting You are God" (Psalm 90:2). Only God has the power to create something out of nothing.

One of the fundamental truths of Christian stewardship is the understanding that everything that exists belongs to God. The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein" (Psalm 24:1). God lays claim to all living creatures. "For every beast of the forest is Mine and the cattle on a thousand hills. I know all the birds of the hills, and all that moves in the field is Mine" (Psalm 50:10-11). God even claims the inanimate objects. "The silver is Mine, and the gold is Mine, declares the Lord of hosts" (Haggai 2:8). All creation belongs to God the Creator.

As God's stewards, we must never forget that God has given us a position of responsibility to care for His creation. Because He has entrusted us with this responsibility, we are accountable for how we manage what He entrusts to us. In order for us to be the faithful stewards that God wants us to be, we need to keep the perspective that God is the creator and owner of all things and we are His managers. When our purpose is to honor and please the Lord with our lives and resources, we will hear Him say, "Well done, good and faithful servant" (Matthew 25:21).

### Stewardship Corner

We could say that a contented person sees his cup half-full rather than half-empty. Do your actions indicate that you are content? The Apostle Paul had learned the secret of contentment, for he realized that, in every circumstance, he was in his Father's hands. He had been at the point of death several times. He had suffered much, yet he said, "I have learned to be content whatever the circumstance" (Philippians 4:11). He found that contentment involves learning to love God and to trust in His will regardless of the circumstances in which he found himself. When we abide in Christ through Word and Sacrament, we find contentment. Realizing and recognizing what we have (the presence of God), rather than lamenting what we lack (nothing if we have Christ), brings us contentment.

Thanks to Sysco for the wonderful donations we received this month of eggs, ground beef, chicken wings, and beverages. God answered our prayer after months of empty and unplugged freezers! Glory be to God while we continue to impact the community. Thanks also to Elmhurst Food Pantry for food donations and allowing us to purchase Holiday Hams, Turkeys, Meal boxes and other foods.

Expansion Project Update: We're moving forward with the expansion project and waiting on an updated estimate from Big Buildings, the manufacturer and installer of the pantry building. Once a new estimate is received, a new budget plan will be created and fundraising to resume. The next step is to purchase the blueprints needed to plan the construction phases which requires a non - refundable deposit on the building. Second step is to confirm the building and foundation size by staking/taping off the area, (weather permitting). Updated estimates still needed for electrical, plumbing, solar panel installation and construction of walk-in cooler. Because of the rising costs of everything, especially construction materials, it's important to make sure we have enough funding to begin.

**Small Business Loan:** Inland Bank Agreed to consider a small business loan to the pantry to enable the commencement of construction. This needs to be discussed and options reviewed.

Volunteers: Thank you all, everyone is appreciated for the many hours and hard labor you put into this ministry throughout the year. I cannot thank you enough for the joy of serving with you and the fellowship in Christ. Thanks to Donn Hempel, Gay Svec and their students (1-4 grade) for helping set-up for pantry days.




