Misseo Dei—Our Future Optics

The word "optics" is one you have probably heard quite a bit the past few years, especially on the major news networks. The word "optics" refers to how a situation, action, or event, is perceived by the public or by a group of people. It goes something like this: "Administrators worry about the bad optics of hiring a new staff during a budget crisis." The past few months members of Immanuel have gathered for what are called "Visioning Retreats." These retreats provided a platform for asking some very important questions pertaining to who we are as a congregation. More specifically we asked: what do we do well as a congregation? what are the needs of the community around us? and, (God forbid) would the community even notice if we were to close our doors?

Tough questions to be sure but questions that we must address in light of current trends for Christian churches. During these retreats we learned how our culture perceives Christianity (its optics) in the twenty -first century. Our facilitator Rev. Keith Haney led us through a process to help us understand the many challenges congregations face on a regular basis; challenges that, in many instances, effect their very existence. Working together we were able to evaluate who we are as followers of Jesus Christ in this place at this present time. More importantly, its greater purpose was to help us look ahead and visualize who we could be as God's people in this community in which we are situated. In the end, this exercise helped us focus on looking beyond ourselves and look instead to those around us; to be Christ to them so that they too might know God's love and salvation through his Son. This is called Misseo Dei; or the mission of God. "This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all" (1 Timothy 2:3-5a).

Our group has proposed a Vision for Immanuel and will present it at our next Voter's Meeting on June 9th. Please be sure to attend because, as members of Immanuel, you play a vital role in God's mission. In presenting Immanuel's Vision, we will need your approval—your blessing. Copies of the statement will be available for those who cannot attend.

Continuing the theme of mission, on June 9th we will celebrate the Feast of Pentecost—also known as the birth of the Church. The Holy Spirit was poured out then and continues to be poured out today. Checking on our Job as Stewards

A young boy walks into a small drug store and asks the druggist, "Could I use the telephone?" The druggist replies, "You certainly can," and shows him where the telephone is. The boy calls a grocery store and asks the man who answers the phone, "Is your grocery store looking for someone to stock the shelves?" The man says, "No, we already have a stock boy." The boy inquires, "If he isn't doing a good job, maybe you need to get someone who will do a better job." The man replies, "No, we are pleased with the work the boy is doing," so the boy hung up the telephone.

The druggist hears the conversation and says to the boy, "I'm sorry you didn't get the job." The boy says, "I don't need a job, because I am the stock boy. I was checking to see what they thought of my work."

What if we could call God to ask about the job we are doing as His stewards? If it were possible to call, what kind of response would you expect to hear? Would God see you as a person who acknowledges all that you have as having been given to you by Him and yourself as a manager, not an owner? Would God tell you that you are using your time, talents, and money in ways that please Him? Would God commend you for feeding the hungry, for sheltering the homeless, for giving generously to those in need? Would God be pleased with what you are giving to His Church? Would God tell you, "Well done, good and faithful steward" (Matthew 25:23)?

Unfortunately, we all fall well short of God's standards, but, because of what Christ did for us on the cross, we are forgiven for all the times that we have failed to be faithful stewards. With God's grace given to us through His Son, we can be molded and transformed into God-pleasing stewards. In Christ, we can be stewards who do God's work well.

In his letter, Peter wrote, "Always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you" (1 Peter 3:15). God blesses us with minds to learn and mouths to speak. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, God will give us the words and the courage to use them. Along with most people, we are eager to talk about the weather, sports, economy, or politics, but, as Christians, we have been given the treasure of the Gospel message—something vastly more important to talk about. Our attitude should be like that of Peter and John, who, when commanded to stop speaking of Christ, said, "We cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20).
