# In Changing Times God Provides

Psalm 90

<sup>1</sup>Lord, you have been our dwelling place

in all generations.

<sup>2</sup> Before the mountains were brought forth,

or ever you had formed the earth and the world,

from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

In a world of rapid change, the above verses are a good reminder for believers in Christ that no matter how intimidating and unsettling the changes are to our nation, God never changes. It sounds trite but I believe that in these last days they are more important than ever. Each generation has its own challenges and believes that their moment in history is like no other – we also believe that. In two recent articles in The Lutheran Witness (LW), Gene Edward Veith discusses the various changes that are taking place across our land that followers of Jesus Christ cannot ignore. These changes directly affect the core beliefs of Christianity, the decisions we make on a daily basis, and how we walk together as the body of Christ.

In his article, "Changes on the Horizon" (March 2021) Veith raises certain problematic issues that challenge Christianity in America. He discusses The Equality Act and the Do No Harm Act specifically. If you are not familiar with these bills you should be. The passing of either bill would cause great harm to the Church and to our schools. Veith ends his article with these words: "As God's people, Christians should not be surprised at the persecution aimed squarely at the church. In times of struggle, the church does well to remember David's exhortation: 'Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation'" (Ps 146:3). He is sounding the alarm; we should take notice and act.

In the May 2021 issue of LW Veith has another article addressing Cancel Culture, another cultural phenomenon that you are surely aware of by now. Cancelling as an ideology has become the norm for our society and brings with it very damaging consequences to our freedom of speech. Here Veith breaks down very simply, the characteristics of Cancel Culture. Cancelling is changing the fabric of our society. Both articles are fairly short and easy to read. There are other important topics addressed in LW, topics focusing on how Christians are to navigate our modern world and respond with a Biblical worldview. I will make them available to you. Moreover, God has so much to say about our place in this world. In troubling times He provides a refuge through His Word. Paul says, that our struggle is not against "flesh and blood, but against…the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places" (Eph 6:12). *cont. on page 2*

# Blessings on your Stewardship Journey

### Guided by the Eyes of the Heart

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus spoke about two treasures (Matthew 6:19-20). We either seek "treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal" or "treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal." We are all treasure seekers because we either want to enjoy treasures on earth or treasures in heaven. Our choices, decisions, and actions are dictated by what we hold dear. What we treasure dictates how we think about ourselves and our relationships with others and most important with God.

So what is your treasure? What causes you to love the treasures or the things of this world or the treasure that God offers? Why do some of us follow one path and others a different one? God gives us two eyes to see, and they are an enormous help for our existence. However, they do not provide help as to treasure we serve. In his book Redeeming Money, which Paul David Tripp suggests that we have another pair of eyes and those eyes are eyes of the heart. This set of eyes makes up an important part of our vision system. He wrote: "The eyes of the heart are always envisioning something. They are always fixed and focused on some hope, some dream, something you value. What the eyes of your heart envision will shape what your physical eyes look for and notice. Your physical vision is not neutral. No, it is guided by the eyes of your heart...What, for you, is the treasure dream that shapes the way you see your world? What physical things get your focus because they connect to the treasure that has already commanded the focus of your heart?...The treasures of your heart will always shape the way you see."

Later in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said, "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money" (verse 24). Jesus is telling us that either God or money will be our treasure and become the master in our hearts. We are told that we can't serve both God and money. In this verse, Jesus points out that money above everything else can keep our hearts from making Him their treasure. We can say that no heart is free. As Jesus said, we either seek treasures on earth or in heaven.

As sinful people, our hearts are inclined to seek treasures on earth. Only with God's Word working through the Holy Spirit can the grip that money and material things have on us be broken. In our prayers, let us ask God not only to give us good eyesight, but, more important, to give us even better vision with the eyes of our hearts so that we can clearly see the treasures in heaven which will give us joy and peace on earth and life eternal with Jesus.
