"Merry Christmas! This month as we celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ, I would like to share with you some timely words from a well-respected publication that always puts Christ first in all things - especially Christmas." - Pastor Steve

Who Is Jesus?

Some couples expecting a baby are eager to know the sex of the child beforehand for obvious reasons – like appropriate nursery décor, blue or pink clothing, even choosing names. Others like to wait till the baby is born to find out if they are parents of a baby boy or a baby girl.

Joseph and Mary had no such dilemma. An angel appeared to each with the same message: "She will bear a son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins. All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: 'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call His name Immanuel' (which means God with us)" (Matthew 1:21-23).

Thirty plus years later, this Jesus rode into Jerusalem as people shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He Who comes in the name of the Lord!" but some asked, "Who is this?" After all Jesus had done throughout His three-year ministry, people still didn't know who He was! Even those who answered the question gave an insufficient reply: "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth in Galilee" (Matthew 21:9-11).



The same terrible reality is ours today: Not everyone knows who Jesus is. Some, like those in Jesus' triumphal path that day, say He was a great prophet or teacher. Others say He was a fake, an imposter. How would you answer the question, "Who is Jesus?" We, like Peter, have the only true answer: "[He is] the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16). Not only did Peter have the answer, he directs us, "In your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and

respect..." (1 Peter 3:15 NIV).

As stewards of the Gospel, we must be prepared. We must be studying God's Word and be in prayer that we might be empowered by the Word and equipped by His Spirit to give answers to those who ask and to use the wonderful, natural opportunities that the Christmas season affords to speak about the Savior, the reason for our Christmas joy.

May God empower us all to spread the wonderful news that Jesus Who is the Savior of the world has come to redeem us and to give us an abundant life now and life with Him in eternity.

Blessed to Be a Blessing

May we during this holiday season be mindful of all the wonderful and amazing blessings that come from God. Because God gives, we receive, and then we can give. Interestingly, in giving, we receive even more. Jesus said, *"It is more blessed to give than to receive"* (Acts 20:35).

God is a loving and giving God. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). Through His Word and Sacraments, God provides:

- His grace that gives us this life and life eternal.
- His love that didn't spare His only Son.
- His forgiveness.

His victory over sin and death.

In spite of our unworthiness and our sinful ways, God blesses us physically and spiritually. He promises never to leave us or forsake us (Hebrews 13:5). God promises that, when we draw near to Him, He will draw near to us (James 4:8). He loves us unconditionally. God gives and keeps on giving. Because Jesus gives us His love, grace, and goodness, we are enabled to be loving and giving people. *"We love because He first loved us"* (1 John 4:19). All love comes from God. We are enabled to love only because we have received His love.

God's Word clearly directs us to use the blessings we receive from Him to bless others. We are blessed to be a blessing. In Christ's name, we are to clothe the naked, feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, and help the sick (Matthew 25:35-36). God blesses us not only to take care of our needs; He blesses us so that we can use what we receive to bless others. Paul wrote "So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith" (Galatians 6:10). Paul's words to the church in Corinth and to us. "You will be made rich in every to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God." (2 Corinthians 9:11).

The wonderful thing is that, as God blesses us to bless others, we are blessed again. When we give faithfully and generously, we will hear God's words, *"Well done, good and faithful servant"* (Matthew 25:21). As people who are a blessing to others, we will enjoy intimate fellowship with our Father and His Son, Jesus. Is there any greater blessing than this?
